



Using Dragon Medical Practice Edition on devices with high DPI displays



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Known issues using Dragon Medical Practice Edition on devices with high DPI displays

The following information applies to devices, such as Windows tables and Ultrabooks, where the display magnification is set to 150%.

- NLP commands for some applications that use absolute button or menu locations may not work. For example, Dragon's built-in integration with Outlook 2013.
- The DragonBar overlaps with or is overlapped by maximized application windows. To resolve this issue, you can set the display magnification to 100%.
- When using Dragon in tray-icon mode, you cannot click on the menu items after right-clicking on the tray icon. You have to use voice commands to restore the DragonBar. This only occurs if a user uses a finger to touch the screen. If the user uses a high resolution pointing device, such as a keyboard or the pen that ships with the Microsoft Surface Pro tablet, the menu is functional.

Please be advised that Nuance does not currently support using Dragon Medical Practice Edition on devices with high DPI displays. You may do so if this system configuration works in your environment.
